BLOOD THINNERS MEDICATIONS THAT PREVENT CLOTS

BLOOD THINNERS ARE MEDICINES THAT PREVENT BLOOD CLOTS FROM FORMING. BLOOD CLOTS CAN CAUSE HEART ATTACKS, STROKES, AND OTHER BLOCKAGES. THEY DO NOT BREAK UP CLOTS THAT ALREADY EXIST IN YOUR BODY, BUT THEY CAN PREVENT THOSE CLOTS FROM GETTING BIGGER.

- HEPARIN
- WARFARIN (COUMADIN)
- APIXABAN (ELIQUIS)
- RIVAROXABAN (XARELTO)
- DIABIGATRAN (PRADAXA)

- ASPIRIN
- CLOPIDOGREL (PLAVIX)
- TICAGRELOR (BRILINTA)
- PRASURGREL (EFFIENT)

ANTICOAGULANTS:

 SLOW DOWN YOUR BODY'S PROCESS OF **MAKING CLOTS**

ANTIPLATELETS:

 PREVENT BLOOD CELLS CALLED PLATELETS FROM CLUMPING TOGETHER TO FORM A CLOT. THESE ARE MAINLY FOR PATIENTS WHO HAVE HAD A HEART ATTACK OR STROKE.

CAN I EVER STOP THEM?

PATIENTS WHO HAVE:

YOU SHOULD NOT STOP TAKING YOUR BLOOD THINNERS UNLESS SPECIFICALLY TOLD TO BY YOUR HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER. STOPPING YOU BLOOD THINNER CAN INCREASE YOUR RISK OF CLOTS. IF YOU HAVE TROUBLE GETTING YOUR MEDICATION FROM THE PHARMACY DUE TO COST OR AVAILABILITY, CONTACT YOUR HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

- CERTAIN HEART OR BLOOD VESSEL DISEASES
- AN ABNORMAL HEART BEAT CALLED "ATRIAL FIBRILLATION" AKA A FIB
- HEART VALVE REPLACEMENT
- RISK OF BLOOD CLOTS AFTER SURGERY
- CONGENITAL HEART DEFECTS

POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS

- BLEEDING
- UPSET STOMACH, NAUSEA, AND DIARRHEA
- OTHER SIDE EFFECTS MAY DEPEND ON THE SPECIFIC MEDICATION.

CALL YOUR PRACTITIONER IF YOU HAVE ANY SIGN **OF SERIOUS BLEEDING SUCH AS:**

- HEAVIER THAN NORMAL MENSTRUAL BLEEDING
- RED OR BROWN URINE, OR RED OR BLACK POOP
- BLEEDING FROM YOUR NOSE OR GUMS THAT DOES NOT STOP QUICKLY

PRACTICING SAFETY:

BLOOD THINNERS REQUIRE EXTRA SAFETY PRACTICES BY BOTH PATIENTS AND PRACTITIONERS. THEY MAY INTERACT WITH CERTAIN FOODS, MEDICINES, VITAMINS, AND ALCOHOL. BE SURE TO LET YOUR PRACTITIONER KNOW WHAT SUPPLEMENTS YOU TAKE. YOU MAY NEED REGULAR BLOOD TESTING TO CHECK IF YOU BLOOD IS TOO THIN, OR MORE PRONE TO CLOTS WHILE TAKING THESE MEDICATIONS.
